Lynda Scheben - Ford Family Foundation Neighborhood & Fuel Mitigation Grant Update There will be a Fuel Reduction effort .

4-year project in two phases. Encourages residents to fill out the landowner agreements. CEQA assessment will be first phase. Prior to fuel reduction CEQA assessment must be done. Vestra Resources out of Redding will be the contractor. 2nd phase is the removal of hazardous fuels. Participating landowners will have final say on what fuels will be removed and can pull out from project at any time. Project info and landowner agreements will be made available at City Hall. Look for pop up info booths at Manfredi's for next 3 Fridays from 10 –2 p.m.
